Symptoms of swine flu in people are similar to the symptoms of regular human flu and include fever, cough, sore throat, body aches, headache, chills and fatigue. There are antiviral medicines you can take to prevent or treat swine flu. There is no vaccine available right now to protect against swine flu.

- The work of the heart can never be interrupted. The heart's job is to keep oxygen-rich blood flowing through the body. All the body's cells, especially those in the brain, need a constant supply of oxygen. Brain cells live only four to five minutes after their oxygen is cut off, and death comes to the entire body. The heart serves as a pump. This pump is divided into four chambers connected by tiny doors called valves. The chambers work to keep the blood flowing round the body in a circle. Heart diseases can result from the heart muscle, the valves or the pacemaker. Until the 20th century, few doctors dared to touch the heart. In 1953 all this changed as Dr. Gibbon of U.S.A. developed a machine that could take over temporarily from the heart and lungs. Blood could be routed through the machine by passing the heart so that surgeons could work inside it and see what they were doing. Thus began the age of open heart surgery.
